# MAKE BIKE THEFT TOUGHER FOR THIEVES

### RECORD MY BICYCLE DETAILS

You don't have to be a security expert to keep your bicycle safe from thieves.

There are simple things you can do to improve your bicycle security and neighbourhood safety.

### Lock up!

Many bicycles that are stolen have been left unsecured. Don't give thieves the opportunity to steal!

- » Store your bicycle in a garage or locked shed when it is at home.
- » Invest in a good quality lock, such as a 'D lock' and always lock your bicycle when not in use, ensuring the lock is tight.
- » Always secure your bicycle to a fixed object that can't be lifted or removed.

### Recording identifying details / marking your bike...

Police can often struggle to return recovered bicycles due to lack of identification.

- » Create a free profile on **bikelinc.com.au** or simply scan the QR code
- » Record your family's bicycle details, including serial numbers and purchase details.
- » Upload photos of your bikes.

### When out in public...

- » Always lock your bicycle when not riding
- » Try to avoid leaving your bicycle in public areas for long periods of time. If this is unavoidable, lock your bike in a well-lit, visible location where many people walk by and/or close to CCTV cameras.
- » Never leave your bicycle unlocked at the front of your house or a friend's house!

### Going away on holidays?

- » Secure your bicycle inside your house, shed or garage.
- » If taking the bicycle with you on holidays, make sure it is kept secure and out of public view when not in use.
