Over 800 attend the South Hedland Aquatic Centre Open Day

Over 800 community members took part in the fun and activities of the South Hedland Aquatic Centre Community Open Day on Sunday 9 February.

The aquatic centre was officially reopened on the day by Regional Development Minister Hon. Terry Redman MLA, BHP Billiton Iron Ore General Manager - Port Operations Michael Bailey and Town of Port Hedland Mayor Kelly Howlett.

Surfing WA coaches and ex-pro surfers Neil Thompson and Mark Clift held a series of surfing workshops leading up to and on the day, culminating in a surfing competition.

Local community radio station 101.3FM Hedland Community Radio showed their support by broadcasting the event live from 10am to 6pm, interviewing community members on their thoughts on the new aquatic centre.

The free Dive In Movie was cancelled due to a Blue Alert being called at 3pm. The movie will be resheduled and ticket holders can still use their tickets for the next screening.

The Town of Port Hedland would like to acknowledge the event partners BHP Billiton Iron Ore, Pilbara Development Commission and YMCA - without their support, the day would not have been a success.
