

South Hedland Landfill smashes e-waste recovery record



June is Environment Month, and we're celebrating some big wins at South Hedland Landfill. Since the WA Government's e-waste to landfill ban came into effect on 1 July 2024, the Town of Port Hedland has stepped up in a big way.

Thanks to new, dedicated drop-off points at the facility, strong community engagement, and support from our frontline staff, over 11.6 tonnes of e-waste was recovered between January and May 2025.

That's already 1.92 tonnes more than the total recovered during the entire previous year, 2024!

From car batteries, vapes, to old TVs and laptops - our Weighbridge Officers and Plant Operators are helping make sure hazardous items are safely collected and diverted from landfill. It's a team effort, and a clear sign that when we work together, we can create real change.

The Town extends a huge thank you to everyone for doing their part to protect our environment and support a circular economy. Let's keep the momentum up and continue to lead the way in sustainability.
