2 Who should	You should fill in this form if you:

3 Who is an	To qualify as an occupier you must have a right, under a lease, tenancy agreement or other legal					
occupier	instrument, to be in continuous occupation of the property for at least the next 3 months. When the Chief Executive Officer of the local government is considering your claim, he or she may ask you for a copy of your lease or tenancy agreement to support your claim. You do not					
	need to provide a copy unless asked.					
4 Silent	If having your address on the register or on the roll would put your safety, or that of your family,					
address	at risk you may ask the Chief Executive Officer not to show your address on the register or on					
	the roll. To do this you must give to the Chief Executive Officer a statutory declaration setting out					
	the reasons why you do not want your address shown on the register or on the roll.
