Town re-stabilises damaged sand dunes in conservation effort

The Town of Port Hedland has repaired damages to sand dunes along the Goode Street foreshore in Cooke Point, which were caused by strong storm surges associated with ex-Tropical Cyclone Narelle.

The Town and project partners BHP Billiton Iron Ore, with assistance from local Indigenous contracting group Marapikurrinya Pty Ltd and Greening Australia, completed a sand dune stabilisation project in August last year, which would aid the rehabilitation of natural flora on the dunes.

It was encouraging to see that plant growth had occurred after the storm, and the Town's staff continues to water the dunes in between rain events to nurture further growth. The Town has appointed planning and design consultants Cardno Pty Ltd to undertake a geomorphological study (the study of natural environment and landscapes) to develop a longterm sand dune and sand hill stabilisation strategy for Cooke Point and Pretty Pool. Community members are asked to stay off the dunes and refrain from participating in

sand boarding activities as it may result in further damage and erosion of the sand dunes.

The Town of Port Hedland has installed three new fire danger rating boards around Port and South Hedland, to help inform and prepare residents for any potential fire emergencies. The boards have reversible placards, with one side stating 'Prepare Act Survive' and the other side having 'Total Fire Ban Effect'. The 'arrow' used to indicate the fire danger rating will be updated every morning based on information provided by the Bureau of Meteorology, and changed accordingly.
