

Singer brings joy to WA audiences

To say that Melbourne-based singer-songwriter Vanc making a splash on the

making a splash on the Australian music scene is a bit of an understatement. His single Riptide reached number four on the ARIA Australian Artist Singles Chart last week and has clocked up more than half a million hits on YouTube. It was the gold-selling single—from his EP God Loves You When You're Dancing—which

It was the gold-seiling single—from his EP God Loves You When You're Dancing—which undoubtedly helped the 25-year-old snag a contract with veteran US recording company Atlantic Records.
"It's more celectic images and thoughts and strange images I suppose that all fit alongside each other neatly in the end, but it's a bit of a mish-mash," Joy said of his breakthrough song.
"There's a lot of my emotional energy that went into making that song, but there's not much that you can determine about me from (it) I don't think."

"I've got a plus-one (for the festival)," he said. "My aunty moved up there a year ago, she's pretty dedicated, she came all the way down to Perth when I was supporting Julia Stone and playing at (\$4 Joseph's Church)."

two years ago, started his journey to music-making when he was in primary school. playing guitar, when I was able to play songs that I really liked —

He admitted it took him years of writing "pretty crap songs" before he finally produced "something decemt" in 2009 which spurred him on to get creative. 



Our coastline takes centre stage

Port Hedland audiences will be able to explore the town through the eyes of an outsider when it is featured in a documentary series

featured in a documentary series next month.
Challenging Australia's outer definition of a sunburnt country, National Geographic's new documentary Australia: Life on the Edge will take an in-depth look at the large proportion of us who live life on Australia's vast coastline.

The rest of the world may perceive Australians as idyllic jackaroos who live off the land, but the coast has always been essential to our country and our identities as Australians.

identities as Australians.

West Australians can more than attest to that, with our beautiful coastline taking centre stage in

three of the six episodes.
Clinging to the edge of the continent, squeezed between desert and ocean, Perth, the Midwest coast, the Pilbara and the Kimberley all feature in the documentary produced by Fremantle company Prospero Productions and hosted by historian Mat McLachlan.

Creating this documentary was an eye-opener for the war historian who, along with marine biologist Giovanna Fasanelli, biologist Giovanna Fasanein, geologist Andrew Bales and author/adventurer Paul Carter, takes viewers on a journey delving into Australia's water-laden histories.

Colwell may well have thrown Grinspoon somewhere in the mix. Rock showman Phil Jamieson and Co were in fine form at dusk, throwing in tastes of new album Black Rabbits with favourites such as DCx3, More Than You Are and Chemical Heart.

Agency's future in jeopardy

Disabled workers in South Hedland face losing their jobs after a Federal Government restructure of remote employment services left some agencies with drastically reduced funding.

The future viability of Hedland Fersonnel, which specialises in helping people with disabilities obtain and keep employment, is uncertain after the July 1 introduction of the Remote Jobs and Communities Program (RJCP).

Hedland Personnel manager Dianne Lovell said changes brought about by the new S1, 5 billoin RJCP had essentially halved their funding, which is now distributed via Ashburton Aboriginal Corporation.

She said her agency was cutting staff and selling off vehicles just to keep its doors open.

Ms Lovell said the austerity measures would inevitably affect clients, particularly those requiringanigh level of on-the-job support.

"There's going to be a number of clients who will issee their jobs if they don't have the same level of support we currently provide," she

clients who will lose their jobs if Pilbara communities, such as Jigathey don't have the same level of support we currently provide," she said. "But (the RJCP funding changes) won't allow that level."

Ashburton Aboriginal Corporation was awarded the sole RJCP contract for the Port Hedland and Western Desert regions, covering a combined 1600 clients, following

Spate of attacks in Hedland
